#### The Gift of Sound

- It's inspiring!
- ...and expensive.
  - According to ASHA, the surgical procedure costs more than \$40,000.
- Plus, the patient has more to worry about than simply paying for surgery.
  - The total cost of evaluation, the actual device, surgery, aural rehabilitation, speech therapy, and additional parts (such as batteries) is often greater than **\$100,000**.

## What is a cochlear implant?

 A cochlear implant is a device that is surgically implanted into the inner ear that may help those with a severe to profound bilateral hearing loss that do not receive benefit from a traditional hearing aid.





## **UF & Cochlear Implants**

- UF Health performed the first multichannel cochlear implant surgery in the southeastern U.S. in 1985 and 12th in the U.S.
- Stride Against Silence first began in 2006 (this is the 10th annual Stride!)
- Stride helps to purchase new test materials and therapy materials in the speech department for habilitation and rehabilitation, audiological tests, and provide loaner equipment for both the children and adults patients in the clinic.
